The Story Of Job

- Job is introduced as "a man of complete integrity who feared God and turned away from evil." (1:1)
- He was very blessed by God with a great family & material blessings.
- Satan (The Adversary) challenges Job's faithfulness to God as being dependent upon his blessings, so God allows for Satan to test Job's faith through great loss.
- Job endures great loss, and three friends (eventually a fourth) seek to teach Job that his loss could only be a result of sin. Though Job cannot fathom why this has happened, he maintains his integrity, and argues back and forth with his friends for his innocence.
- At the end of the book, God gives Job the opportunity to argue with Him, but Job refuses because he knows better. God rebukes the friends for their rash & foolish words. He then turns around to bless Job even more abundantly for his recognition of God's sovereignty.
