In Paul's sermon at Antioch (Acts 13:16-41) he briefly recounts the history of Israel. After all isn't David the one who disobeyed God in the handling of the ark of the covenant which ended in the death of Uzzah? Isn't David the one who committed adultery and murdered? Isn't David the one who in 2

Samuel 24 sins by numbering the people against the will of God and for his actions 70,000 are struck with pestilence and die? How could this human, who sins just like you and I be a "*man after God's own heart*"? May we consider the answer to that question this morning!
