They Should Know That...

1) You Love The Bible:

- A. God's word is something you love.
- B. Our children know what we love.
- **C. Do you sound like the Psalmist?** (Psalm 119:47, 48, 97, 113, 127, 159, 163, 167)

2) You Read The Bible:

- A. God's word is something you read.
- **B.** In the O.T. God placed a high premium on listening to Him (Deuteronomy 7:12; 12:28; 13:18)
- **C.** In the N.T. we are commanded to listen. (Matthew 17:5; Luke 8:21; Romans 10:17)
- D. Do your kids see you reading God's word?

3) You Follow The Bible:

- **A.** They need to know that we follow God's word. (James 1:22)
 - 1) Our Morals (Ephesians 5:8-10)
 - 2) Work Ethic (Eph. 6:5-8)
 - 3) How we treat our Spouse (Eph. 5:22, 25, 33)
 - 4) How we treat our Neighbors (Matthew 7:12)
 - 5) How we treat Worship (John 4:24)

4) You Want Them to Love, Read, Follow the Bible:

- **A.** God has charged parent with this command. (Deut. 6:1-9; Eph. 6:4)
