




A.For many, feelings constitute a reliable guide in religion.

## The Ends Justify The Means

Moses said, 'THE LORD GOD WILL RAISE UP FOR YOU A PROPHET LIKE ME FROM YOUR BRETHREN; TO HIM YOU SHALL GIVE HEED to everything He says to you. <sup>23</sup> And it will be that every soul that does not heed that prophet shall be utterly destroyed from among the people.'

  - 1) Outside of the church (Lk. 16:27-28)
- "I know my grandmother is in heaven..."
  - 2) Inside the church (Mat. 15:1-20)
- "If it was good enough for my grandfather, it is good enough for me!"



We Have Always Done It That Way

- A. Please do not sell the lost an emotion, sell them the Word! (Ps. 119:105)
- B. Please do not sell the lost worldly things for the sake of salvation. Sell them the Word! (Acts 17:11)
- C. Please do not sell the lost on tradition, sell them the Word! (Col. 3:17)
