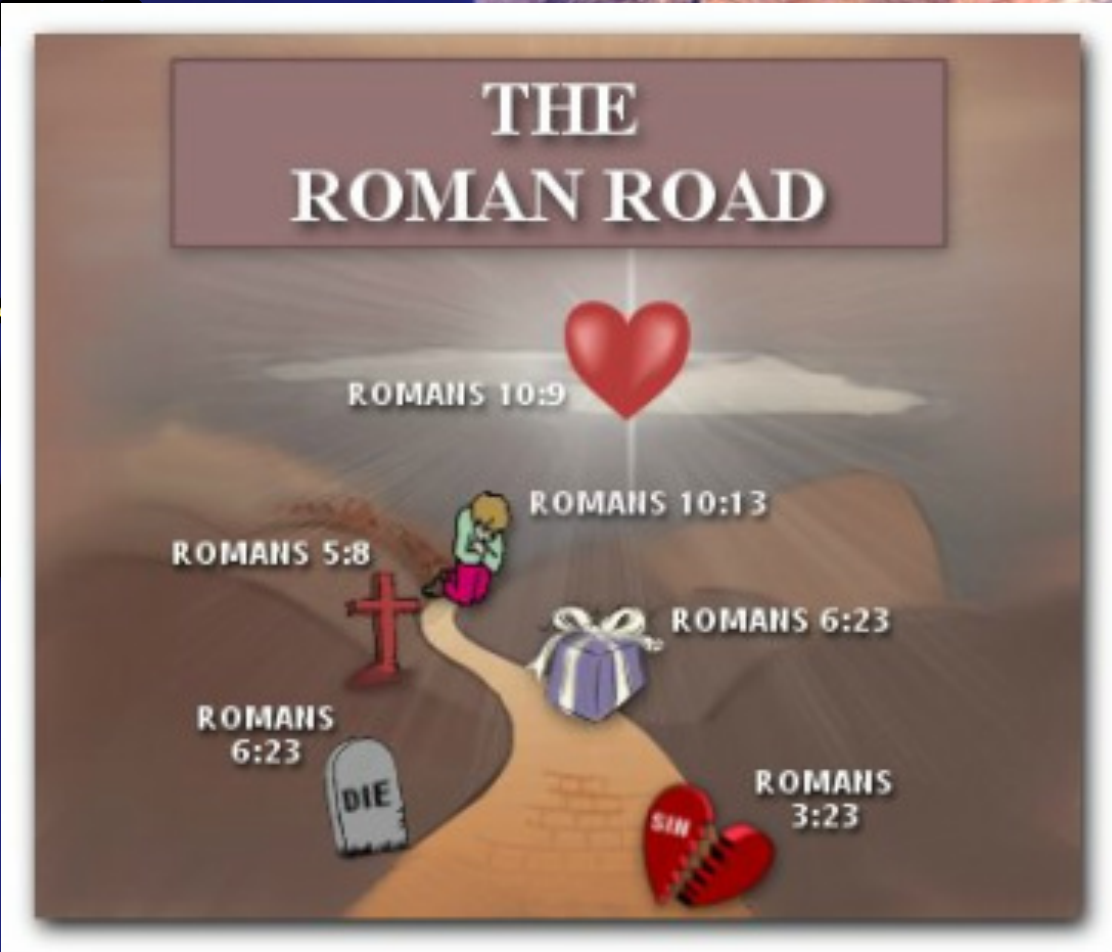

But God commendeth His love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us. (Romans 5:8)

What is the Romans Road?

Simply put, the Romans Road shows the path to Heaven. It uses points from the book of Romans in the Bible to explain God's gift of salvation. At each step we learn something new about why we need salvation, how God has provided for it, and how we receive it.

As you look at each of the six points outlined here, take time to reflect on what God's Word has to say. Remember that the book of Romans was written to people just like you and me: people living in a busy culture, trying to make sense of what is true and what is most important in life.

The Romans Road describes the only way to Heaven. Study it, learn it, and follow it!

God Saves All Who Call Upon Him

Salvation Comes Through Faith
To him that ... believeth on Him that justifieth the ungodly, his faith is counted for righteousness. (Romans 4:5)

Romans Road

Step #1 on the Romans Road

...for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God...
(Romans 3:23)

"There is no one righteous, not even one...
(Romans 3:10)

Step #2 on the Romans Road

Therefore, just as sin entered the world through one man, and death through sin, and in this way death came to all people, because all sinned.
(Romans 5:12)

Step #3 on the Romans Road

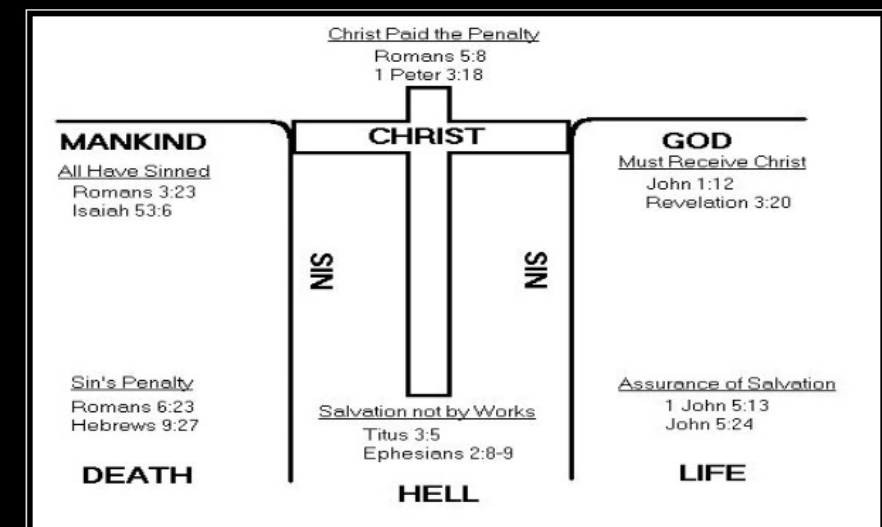
But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.
(Romans 5:8)

Step #4 of the Romans Road....

For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.
(Romans 6:23)

Step #5 (the final step) of the Romans Road...

If you declare with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you profess your faith and are saved.
(Romans 10:9-10)

Road to Samaria Acts 8:5-13

Phillip proclaimed Jesus Christ. (v.5)

The Samaritans heard Philip's preaching. (v.6)

The Samaritans believed Philip's preaching. (v.12)

The believing Samaritans were baptized. (v.12)



Road to Gaza Acts 8:26-40

Phillip preached Jesus to
the Eunuch. (v.35)

The Eunuch believe with
all of his heart. (v.37)

The Eunuch confessed
Jesus as the Son of God.
(v.37)

Philip baptized the Eunuch
in water. (v.38)





Road to Damascus Acts 9:1-19; 22:6-16

Paul is told by Jesus what he must do to obey. (9:5,6; 22:10,14-16)

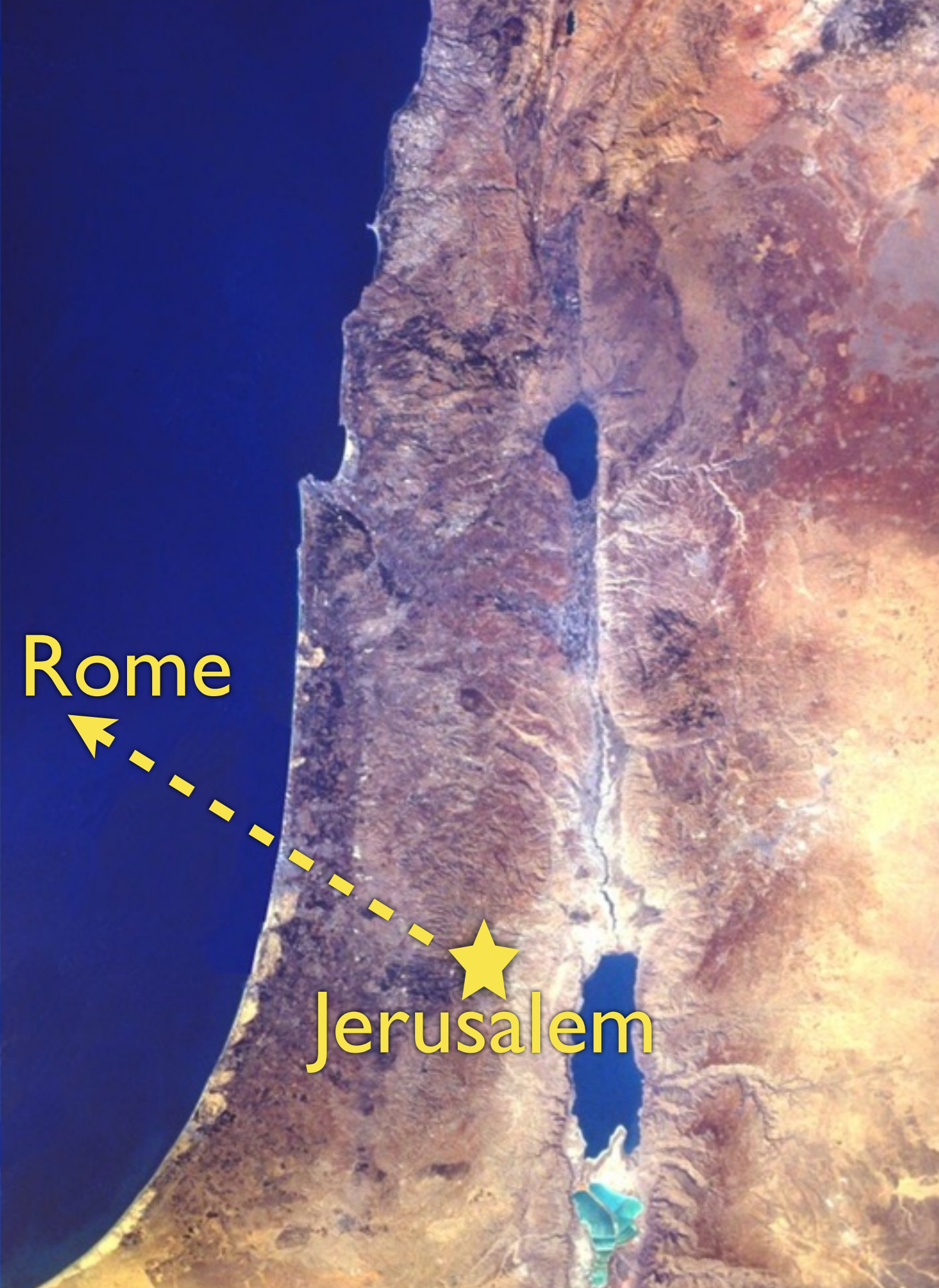
Paul believed because he went into Damascus. (9:8; 22:11)

Paul was baptized. (9:18; 22:16)

Paul changed his life and joined with other saints. (9:19)

God's Plan of Salvation in the Book of Romans

“I certainly do not want to diminish the necessity of Baptism, but this was an article regarding the ‘Romans Road’ verses written for those searching for a Biblical foundation for Salvation, or for those looking for a guide when sharing Christ with others. I do not believe that baptism is essential to Salvation. It is necessary as we pursue holiness and righteousness, but the Bible is clear that Salvation is by grace alone and not by works.”

Repent of the former life
of sin. (6:1,2)

Confess Jesus as the Son
of God. (10:9)

Be immersed in water for
the forgiveness of sins.
(6:3-11)

This is obedience from
