- The youngest city of the seven cities of Asia Minor, it was named for King Attalus II of Pergamum.
- Philadelphia was very successful in a number of areas such as agriculture, leather working, and nearby hot springs.
- It was a very important city for the advancement of Greek culture eastward, and it also held great allegiance to Rome because of her help rebuilding from earthquakes.
- Like many of the other Asian churches, it is believed that Philadelphia was founded during Paul's Ephesian Ministry.
- History tells us there were Christians in Philadelphia (now modern day Alasehir) until the 13th or 14th century.
