


What is Biblical righteousness?

Hebrew word tsĕdaqah meaning to have the right relationship between oneself and God and others.

What is Biblical justice?

Hebrew word *mishpat* meaning retributive justice or the act of upholding those who are vulnerable.



"God, give your justice to the king and your righteousness to the king's son. He will judge your people with righteousness and your afflicted ones with justice." (Psalm 72:1,2)




